Best-ever Banana Bread



The best way to warm up your house and make you feel like cosying up to the fire this winter is this delightful banana bread.

INGREDIENTS

2 bananas
2 tablespoons golden syryp
¾ cup sugar
1 egg
1 cup self-raising flour pinch of salt

METHOD

Heat oven to 180°C (160°C fan forced). Grease and line the base of a loaf pan. In a medium bowl, mash bananas then add golden syryp. Add sugar and stir in. Add egg, sifted flour and salt and lightly mix until combined.

Pour into loaf pan and cook for 30 minutes or until a skewer is inserted into the middle comes out clean.

Allow to cool in tin for 10 minutes, then turn onto wire rack to cool.

Enjoy it warm straight from the oven or lightly grill it and then enjoy with butter melting on top.

Tip: you can also make variations to this by throwing in a handful of chopped dates just before pouring into tin to bake or adding choc chips to make a choc banana bread.

Serving size: Serves 8

Cooking time: Less than 60 minutes

Most of us met up at the Erica pub for dinner and then cruised into the Merringtons camping ground. Graeme and Sue were already there and had a fire ticking over. The rest of the crew turned up early on the Saturday morning raring to go.

lan from Going 4WD turned up nice and early and Noel from the Parkers Corner DSE wasn't far behind. Noel gave a short talk to us about what the plan of attack was to be for the day and did his first stint of many in front of lan's camera. The first stop was to be an area along the Williams Spur Tk where we gathered around a ton of quartz rock which we then took across to the Edwards Reef Cemetery just off Donnelly's Creek Tk.

Along the way we stopped to look at an extremely well made hut that Noel had recently discovered. Clearly the people that built this knew what they were doing and it was of a better and more sound construction than many of the legit hut in the high country. Unfortunately as this is an illegal hut it's destined to have a run in with a front end dozer.

Noel explained to us that he wanted a large rock at the head of the grave going down to smaller rocks at the foot end of the grave. As these graves were unmarked, and we didn't want to dig any up to check where the head was, we assumed that they were buried with the head up hill. It didn't take us too long and we had them all marked out. Noel gave a little talk about the area and they people that were buried there giving us some inspiring insight to the days gone by.

We gathered more rocks along Williamson Spur, this time half filling lan's ute and then headed towards Toombon. Coming out of the Junction river crossing Noel had all sorts of trouble heading up the greasy hill on the other side, probably the 1½ ton of rock in the trailer didn't help. Michael managed to get pass and snatch him up the short section then we continued onto to Toombon.



We had a short stop to look at what is left of the Toombon mullock heap which was partially washed away in the floods last year. Some of the guys climbed over the heap to the old mine site and the remnants of the boilers and stamper that are still there. It was only a short distance further on to the Toombon Cemetery and there we met the trustees Graeme & Linda Code. They were very enthusiastic about what we were doing and showed us were the graves laid. This was a lot harder than the previous site as there was a 2 meter embankment that we had to pass the rocks up and the whole cemetery was on a slope. Everyone really pulled together and got the job done. Noel was extremely thankful to us for the work we carried out, stating that it has been the most worthwhile project he has been involved in during his 30 years as a ranger.

Over the last 16 years member clubs of the Four Wheel Drive Victoria have supported Oxfam Australia in their annual delivery of Christmas Trees. This has become a very successful fund raising activity selling and delivering fresh green Christmas trees to homes in metropolitan Melbourne.

This letter is to inform those clubs who have not previously been involved how the operation works and to remind those clubs who have helped in recent years that the deliver dates this year are Saturday 6th and Sunday 7th December.

Volunteers carry out the whole operation. Last year nearly \$120,000 was raised, that's about \$500 per delivery vehicle, and went towards alleviating poverty and social injustice within Australia and overseas. That's a total of over \$95,000 raised by members of Victorian Four Wheel Drive Clubs.

We ask for drivers, navigators and vehicles that can carry 8 to 25 freshly cut trees, with or without a trailer. Many 4WD clubs have found this a fun activity that makes a considerable contribution to the larger community in which we live.

We meet at the Scout Hall, Pakenham St., Blackburn (Melway Map 47 H 12) on Saturday 6 December, or Princes Hill Primary School, Wilson St., Nth Carton (Melway 29 J 11) on Sunday 7 December. On Saturday we deliver to the south and eastern side of Melbourne and on the Sunday the north and western side. You pick the area you would like to deliver the trees, and the day and time (before 11am) you arrive at the depot. We give you a very well organized list of addresses with Melway grid references, all in close proximity to each other. All you do is drop off the tree that has already been paid for. The smiles you receive from the younger recipients would be second only to that of them greeting Santa Claus. It will take each team 1 to 3 hours, and we encourage you to meet for a BBQ or social get together before or afterwards.

If your club can help I would appreciate a phone call with the approximate number of vehicles by late October and I would immediately forward you a form (or use the blank Excel Spread Sheet that should be attached with this document) so the details of each driver can be filled in and returned to us by the end of November. Please email or phone me if you would prefer I post your club a hard copy form now to pass around at your next club meeting for volunteers to add their details.

Last year the following 4WD clubs generously donated their services: Idlers, Adventurers, CFA, All Terrain, Jackaroo, Knox, Nissan, LROCV, Melb. Jeep Owners, Pajero, Range Rover, CH4WD, Subaru, Toyota Landcruser, VFWD, Wanderers, Toyota and City West, a total of 18 clubs and about 160 vehicles (plus 55 vehicles from Oxfam's other supporters). Also Four Wheel Drive Victoria threw their weight behind the event and in the past have managed to attract television news coverage of the great work being done by club volunteers. Each of the above groups seemed impressed with the nature of the cause and our organization and indicated a desire to be involved again.

For those club members who may like to purchase a delivered Christmas tree please feel free to mention in your news letter our web site for online orders: www.fitzroyoxfam.org.au or our phone number. Orders start early November.

Each year I do the rounds of the media to promote tree sales and always mention the great support given by 4WD clubs. Last year a 7 minute interview with John Faine on Radio 774 netted an extra 600 orders. Our feedback is that listeners are so keen to support a good cause when they know that everyone involved is a volunteer and no middle person profits. In the past I have been fortunate enough to have the opportunity on Macca's 'Australia All Over' to give all involved a mention and let the listeners know this tremendous fundraiser could not happen with generous support by volunteer 4WD club members.

Finally I'd like to thank once again all those clubs and members who have so generously supported this vital community fundraising activity over past years.
