



# High Country — Queen's Birthday weekend report

11 - 13 June 2016

Under the cover of early morning darkness, we all met up at the BP / Macca's fuelstop near Officer. After a quick bite and a cuppa, we were soon rolling down the freewayin the direction of Gippsland. After reaching the small township of Briagolong, we turned off at Marathon Road and headed 56km up north into the hills. It was an easy drive to start with and, after stopping briefly to air down for corragations, we soon found ourselves within the boundaries of Alpine National Park



Shortly afer passing through the park gates, we chanced upon a fresh piece of vennison that an earlier hunter-driver must have dropped on their descent from the hills. Dave was quick to capitalise on the find before we made our way towards Moroka Hut.



After the preceding evening's rain, the track in was a little wet

in spotsbut it was nothing too difficult. We walked the final 250 meters or so to the hut before heading heading back to our vehicles to find a camp site.

We had 3 main camping options to choose from: stay near where we were at Moroka Hut, head eastward in the direction of Horseyard Hut or take the longer option drivingin a southwesterly direction towards Miller's Hut.



After a brief discussion, we opted for the latter as neither Sam nor David had been there before. As we made our way along Maroka Range Track, the rain turned to sleet and eventually to snow. By the time we reached Wellington Track, the greenery began to whiten significantly. We progressed with caution until we crested Mount Wellington and proceded further south down to around the 1500 meter mark.



Much to our disappointment, Miller's Hut was already taken. We scouted around the area and found a nice flat sheltered spot where we began to set up for the evening. The kids played in the snow while the rest of us set about making camp. Dave had brought his portable Taj Mahal (a huge tarp shelter) with him so we could all keep out of the elements. Sam and I fetched some wood while Dave cranked up the fire and, after a quick inspection of the recently repaired hut, we settled in for the evening. We were all so wrapped with the unexpected snowfall that it was hard to wipe the smiles from our faces.

By Sunday morning, everything was thoroughly snow-covered. It made for slow progress as we packed up camp with cold -to-numb fingers and low-laying fog. We made the return journey to the peak of Mount Wellington just as the morning cleared. With blue skies above, the views really opened up and we stared in awe at the various plateaus and vistas below.

We stopped in at Horseyard Hut / Flat just in time for lunch and then we made our

## **Immediate Past President**

The position has full voting rights similar to those of the elected Committee members.

## **Vice President**

The Vice Presidents role is a voted Committee position and it is the Vice Presidents responsibility to be fully versed with the Club Rules.

To convene and run orderly meetings in accordance to the Clubs Constitution in the event of the President is absent

To organise guest speakers for each meeting and be responsible for providing the necessary support, assistance and fellowship to ensure that their presentation is of the highest quality and they leave our meeting with a deep respect for the organisation they have just visited. Furthermore, to introduce those guest speakers to the meeting and move an effective vote of thanks for their presentation.

Assist in all necessary aspects of administration of the Club

## **Secretary's Duties**

The Attendance, Apologies and Visitors books are available for members / visitors to sign in

Take the minutes of the General Meeting

Present the incoming and outgoing correspondence at the General Meeting

Type up the minutes noting number of attendees, apologies and visitors

Attend the committee meeting

File correspondence in and minutes of the general meeting

Attend to any outgoing correspondence as determined by the committee

Ensure new member kits are up to date and available as required

Maintain the membership list

Print and Laminate membership cards for current year ensuring that they are signed (MemberCard06 -07.doc may be used as a template)

attend to annual duties, Fill out the Committee Details and Membership numbers and hand to the Treasurer to return to the Association with payment

Ensure that you have become signatory for Club Bank Account (coordinate with Treasurer)

## **Treasurer's Duties**

Ensure copies of other relevant forms are available if or when needed (Track survey reports, Accident Survey Form, Trip Incident form, Personal Information forms, Trip rating information)

Ensure all TDF (Trip Data Forms) are filled in correctly and a copy is passed onto the Newsletter Editor

Liaise with the Newsletter Editor and follow up any trip reports that haven't been submitted
