

We reached the waterfall in about an hour-ish. There we had a snack, rest and took photos. Shane decided to go exploring and scale the rock face of the waterfall...








After the rest, we tackled up the stair case over the waterfall until we reached a sign. Shane looked at the map and told us it was downhill from here—great!

Finally reached the highest point and it became downhill which started impacting my knees a bit. Eventually we hit the flat ground and it was time to find a spot for lunch.


We initially found this spot under a bridge but decided against it due to lack of shade and seating.

This was to be the 100 years anniversary for the murders at Wonnangatta. The victims were Jim Barclay the manager of Wonnangatta and John Bamford the cook and general hand. It was believed that John had committed the murder but his body was found in the Mount Howett area shot in the head, so he was ruled out.

This has been an unsolved case. There has been a book written on this subject but when we attended the discussion by the interested parties the locals had differing opinions on the outcome. So it's still an mystery.

Stuart and Maree went up on Thursday to secure a spot to camp on the banks of the river. David led the others in on Saturday.
