

We met up with Des and Gary as we passed through Moe, then proceeded together up to the lookout just prior to Thompson Dam. David took a small detour to

Our first area of tidy up work was the Aberfeldy walking track on the O'Keefe track. We found this and the short road in, to be in excellent condition and we quickly completed this track.

We had a short break for morning tea, then we continued down the remainder of O'Keefe track and returned to the main red via Pluto track. As we passed through the township of Aberfeldy, Steve sent his daughters out to clean the signage whilst the remainder of us went to the bottom and waited at the main big sign, which Des cleaned around the bases with a whipper snipper. As he finished, the girls arrived to clean the big sign.

At our next destination (Hanging Rock walking track) we stopped at the off track parking area and had lunch, so we were refreshed prior to descending down the longest track in our area of maintenance. Once again, over winter not much has happened, so our work was very quick and easy to accomplish. With just a chainsaw, and 2 whipper snippers (no lawn mower this time) everything was completed. This happened about 3 times during the remainder of the daylight hours, until the sun dropped out of site and stars appeared, meaning no more clouds. This meant we had a fantastic night around the camp fire without weather dramas.

Everyone enjoyed the night around the evening fire, we were entertained by the kids antics with roasting king sized marsh mellows (thanks Jen) before we all retired for the night.

Next morning was a beautiful morning, warmer than was expected, considering it had actually tried to snow when we were on the ridges during the Saturday's driving excursions (light snow instead of misty rain).



Met up with Joe at BP Officer at 7.30am Friday morning. McMuffin breakfast and coffee for me, health food and ugly-looking smoothie for Joe. Headed off soon afterwards, after hearing from lan and Audrey that they were in place along the on-ramp of the Caltex servo further east at Longwarry.

Meandering along the highway it wasn't long before the white-winged keel was in view and assumed the convoy position that we would follow for the rest of the trip. Not a lot of traffic being the middle of school holidays and most were perhaps still at home preparing for the weekend Grand Final.

The next stop was Stratford for a fuel top-up and walk around to let some blood back into my bum, and yes before you all say it, there was a lot of blood required. A quick snack and we were off again, heading through Stockdale to the Bairnsdale-Dargo Road where we turned left toward Dargo.

Surprisingly enough, this is where we performed the only U-turn for the entire weekend. Slightly excited I turned the convoy onto Billy Goat Bend Road instead of Angusvale Road, a further 4 kilometres north toward Dargo.

A kilometre in we turned left into Treasure Track (rated Medium) which turned out to be a bit of fun as well as providing us with our firewood for the weekend. A narrow, reasonably maintained track with several steep climbs and descents. Completing Treasure Track we turned right into Tabberabbera Track (rated Medium) where we challenged Stuarts rein as the pin-strip king. Narrow, winding, steep in sections the track continued to close in with us providing mere whiteboards for the bush to leave its mark. Close to the junction of Halloran Track we came across a small but open window providing panoramic views over Dargo State Forest.



Completing Tabberabbera Track we turned left into Mitchell River Access Road, a wide, well maintained dirt road into Angusvale Camping Area, our camp for the night. Having not been here before, it was quite spectacular, and unexpected to find a huge open grassed valley that would easily accommodate several hundred campers. As you would expect, most of the better locations along the banks of the Mitchel River were taken. We were only staying overnight so camp was set up on a relatively level area not far from the clean and well-maintained amenities.

Having set up camp the trip leader, keen to test the comfort rating of his new sleeping arrangement laid down and promptly fell asleep. Rudely awakened around 6:30pm by a howling wind with accompanying gusts estimated at around 40 knots it was time to batten down the hatches. Thankfully the mini cyclone didn't last long. Additional guide ropes and a bit of manoeuvring of Joe's vehicle offered enough protection until it was over. The fire was relocated in case it blew up again and just as we settled in, it started to rain. It rained off and on until around 9pm when it cleared leaving a brilliant star-filled sky.



We awoke the following morning to a glorious day. Sunny, warm and no wind. After packing up and leaving camp around 8:30am we made our way back along Mitchell River Access Road turning right into Tabberabbera Track, otherwise known as pin-stripe heaven. We followed Tabberabbera Track all the way to Dargo Road which we crossed and then stopped for morning tea at the beginning of McDonald Gap Track (rated Easy).

Following McDonald Gap track up and over Mt Budgee Budgee we then turned left (south) into Killeen Climb Track (Rated Easy) for a bit of fun and low geared descents with a couple of small shallow creek crossings thrown in along the way. Lunch was taken at the junction of Lees Creek Track before continuing along Lees Creek Track (Rated Medium) to the very end, turning right into Freestone Creek Road. Neither track was overly difficult with their ratings fluctuating between Easy and Medium, however both were good to drive, challenging and demanding concentration. Several small campsites discovered along the way may require a return at some stage for further exploration.



Freestone Creek Road was wide and well-maintained allowing us to move out of low range for the first, and as it turned out, the only time for the entire trip. Four kilometres on we turned right into Lloyd Knob Track and started the climb up and over Lloyd Knob (rated Medium) and a bit of fun.

We followed Lloyd Knob Track all the way onto Blomford Jeep Track (rated Easy) continuing on to Upper New Place Creek Road (rated Medium) with the idea of perhaps an early finish, camping overnight at the ruins of Upper New Place Hut. Mother Nature appears to have reclaimed the ruins as we were unable to locate them.

Plan B saw us continue onto Upper New Place Track (rated Medium) with the intention of camping at a camp marked on the Hema at the junction of Grand Final Spur Track. Aptly named given it was Grand Final Day, however without reception we had no idea what was happening at the 'G'. On arrival and finding 20 plus vehicles, hunters and dogs at the campsite, plan 'C' was actioned.
