

Tuesday

We had a late start on Tuesday after taking care of a few loose ends, so we did not arrive at the Buckland River until after 3pm. We spent a bit of time checking out each campsite as we drove along the Buckland River until we found a site that could

accommodate all of our expected club members. This meant that by the time we set up camp it was already on dusk. We gathered a bit of firewood from around the campsite but it was too damp to start a fire with. So it was an early night after dinner as it was too cold to sit around an empty fireplace.

Wednesday
