



Park and forest track conditions looking good for Cup weekend

Hundreds of forest and park tracks and roads across Victoria will re-open in time for the Melbourne Cup weekend - starting on Saturday 1/11/2014.

Department of Environment and Primary Industries (DEPI) Planning Manager Tony Dowler said: "Roads and tracks are closed temporarily to protect them from damage during the wetter months each year as part of DEPI and Parks Victoria's seasonal road closure program."

"These roads and tracks were closed over winter and spring for public safety and to protect track surfaces as well as water quality and the forest environment," Mr Dowler said.

"While most of the closed roads and tracks which we are re-opening are part of the regular seasonal closures, there are also some being opened following the completion of repairs to damage caused by storms and bushfire."

"Some roads may remain closed because of ongoing repair works."

Chris Rose, Parks Victoria's General Manager Regional Services said: "While we have made every effort to ensure visitors have access for the opening weekend, drivers need to be prepared to come across fallen trees and other debris in some places."

"DEPI and Parks Victoria thank the many Four Wheel Drive Victoria volunteers who put in hundreds of hours of work to assist with the maintenance and promotion of seasonal road closures for the ongoing protection of Victoria's parks and forests," Mr Rose said.

"It's great to see volunteers so committed to working in partnership for the betterment of Victoria's natural spaces."

Visitors are encouraged to obtain the most up- to-date information on access into forest and park areas before they travel.

Aberfeldy track maintenance trip 27th and 28th September 2014 The trip was attended by Stuart Bowker (trip leader) David & Samuel Bruinsma Steve Pitcher Ben Whitworth Ken Beard

The day started off outside the Yarragon bakery, most agreed the food and coffee was great, we headed off

to Moe to meet Ben who had left a major part of his evening meal behind, his steak and as he had with him a brand new fire grate he really wanted to try out, he called in at the Moe supermarket to collect another steak.

We headed up to the Thompson dam to air down, there were many remarks over the UHF as to how full the dam was, so after a quick stop we headed up to Aberfeldy for a quick look around and then up to "The Eldorado" site, where the hot party pies and sauce came out for morning tea.

We left The Eldorado and Stuart took off up the road only to discover we had already passed the intended turn off to the planned site at Aberfeldy Crossing

and after a quick look at the map he changed the route from O'Keefe track to Spud Spur track and we continued on towards Aberfeldy crossing, there was lots of trees that had come down in the forest and many tracks to navigate around them.

David made a few remarks about stopping to clear some off from the tracks but we were on a mission, to clear the fallen timber from the walking track to Aberfeldy Crossing, about another ten minutes went by and



David said "I'm going to remove this tree from the track, Ben could you stop and give me a hand please", the other three vehicles continued on about three hundred meters to Aberfeldy crossing and Stuart walked down to look at how much timber we would need to remove from the walking track. When Ben and David arrived it became apparent why David wanted to stop to clear the track, he was like a kid in a candy store, we all saw it as fallen trees to impede our progress David was looking at it all as "fire wood" and his ute was now full and he was extremely happy.

We moved on to cutting the trees across the walking track to Aberfeldy Crossing, Ken was the first to get his chain saw out to show us how it was done, cutting the biggest of the trees with ease, David was next cutting like they were butter, Stuart got his saw out only to find the new chain was not cutting like it should and over loading the saw, Steve had the hedge clippers out and was cutting the over head branches. Ben and Samuel were doing the heavy lifting and pushing the cut pieces off the track, one piece about 1.5 mts long and 700 mm in diameter rolled off the track and was heard rolling and bouncing all the way to the river below. Stuart returned with another chain and fitted it to his saw and was back in action only to find David and Ken had reached the end of the track so he had to make do with trimming some of the saplings and making the track a little wider in the narrow sections.







It was now time for a late lunch and to pack up and head off for some more four wheel driving. We headed up O'Keefe track towards the main Walhalla road expecting to hear the Navara had run out of puff with its load of wood on board, but it was not to be, the tenacity of its driver and his heavy right foot ensured it didn't even look like slowing down and once again the "MIGHTY NAVARA" proved its worth.

After arriving in Aberfeldy it was time to say goodbye to David and Samuel who were not staying the night as they had other commitments. The rest of us now four vehicles, headed down Cullen Track and onto Comet Spur Track before turning onto

Eaton Track and heading to check out our other site Hanging rock. We left hanging rock and headed back to Comet Spur track and on to Codes flat where Stuart had mentioned he wanted to buy some honey from the roadside stall, when we arrived there was only two jars of honey remaining and Stuart bought one and as Ken was next in line he bought the other, Ben had missed out on his honey and Ken was amused as he had some and Ben replied that Ken had to sleep some time and this became an ongoing joke until we parted the next day and Ken was asked "are you sure you still have your honey".



We arrived at Little O'Tooles only to find the gates locked so we headed for O'Tooles Flat to camp for the night. Ben and Stuart headed out in Bens car to collect some wood and ended up going up Flats track and could be seen high up on the hill by Steve and Ken who were getting the fire started.

After dinner and some discussions on celestial navigation and which way was north and why the Southern Cross had suddenly disappeared below the horizon (which turned out to be a hill) it was time for bed. The next day started with breaky and off to do some four wheel driving we headed out and up White Star track up to the White Star mine Stuart lead the way and said the last 170 mts down to the boiler was very steep he had been down there before, so Ken with his trusty 76 series V8 Toyota gave Ben a lift to the bot-



tom and did the 15 point turn and headed back up and made it look so easy.

After leaving the White Star mine we headed down Middle Star track to Donnelly Creek Road and were heading to Flats track when Steve said that he had been up "S" track and it was a little more exciting than Flats track so, we turned up "S" track which proved to be much more challenging than what we had done so far, after we reached the top and turned onto Pheasant Track and were heading down to the river Steve said I think this is the track we had

our wheels locked up last time and kept sliding it was that steep, on this day it wasn't too bad and we all arrived at the river safely, we waited for the brakes to cool before heading across the river and commencing the climb up the other side up towards the main road to the dam.

By now the wind was really blowing hard and as we drove across the Thompson Dam wall we could see the white caps out in the middle so we decided to air up at the lookout thinking it may have been a bit more protected from the wind, we aired up, had lunch and said our goodbyes and all headed for home after a job well done.

The picturesque Warburton Highway, in the Yarra Valley, is home to some of the most inviting wineries in the region. A

great time to visit is during the Shedfest Wine Festival, held annually on the second weekend in October. Seville Estate

The way it works is you start and buy a glass for \$15.00 and the money raised goes to the Hillcrest CFA. There were 8 wineries open for tasting.

We made a plan first stop Whispering Hills. Bubbles for the girls, we were a bit early for this winery they were not very organised so off we head not sure how this will pan out.

Campfire Nachos

Serves 2 Hungry People

Ingredients:

1 bag Corn Chips
1 14oz can Refried beans
1 6oz can Black olives
1/2lb Cheddar cheese, grated
2 Tomatoes
1/2 Onion, diced
1 8oz jar Salsa
1 14oz can sweet corn
1 4oz can diced jalapenos



Directions:

Build a 1'x1' bed of hot coals underneath a campfire grate or in the center of stable rocks which will support the base of your cast iron pan. Place a layer of chips in the bottom of the pan, and top them with half of the: beans, olives, cheese, tomatoes, onion, salsa, corn, and jalapenos. Place a second layer of chips on top of the other ingredients, and then top these chips with the remaining ingredients, finishing with the cheese on top. Cover the top of the pan with a sheet of foil, and carefully place the pan on top of the grate or rocks. Let nachos cook, maintaining the hot coals for 10-15 minutes or until the cheese is melted. Move the pan to a heatproof location and allow nachos to cool for a few minutes.
