





<u>Four Wheel Drive Victoria</u> have a track grading classification scale which has been developed to assist in advising Trip Leaders and participants on 4WD trips of the type of tracks that they can expect to encounter. On most trips participants can expect that a variety of tracks will be traversed each with an appropriate rating. Trip Leaders should advise participants of the range of track ratings expected to be encountered on the planned route. The following classifications will assist in determining an overall Trip Rating:

	The Club encourages all members to participate in a proficiency course to ensure the basic fundamentals of 4-wheel driving are gained.
	Theory provides an overview of the tread lightly principles, vehicles dynamics and functions, tackling various terrains along with other subjects. This provides the background for the practical weekend. Practical we run through individual vehicles and differences, basic recovery equipment and recap some of the theory (including homework). We then begin the practical side running through several techniques to ensure safe vehicle recovery when in difficult situations. Once all participants are confident with these, we hit the tracks to put all the theory into practice.
	Sunday will be a leisurely start then we will traverse a number of tracks which allow you to become familiar with your vehicles' capabilities and gain further confidence. We should be finished by 2 o'clock arriving back to Melbourne around 4. As with past participants the weekend provides confidence to safely 4WD either with the club or friends

Details

Our journey began on Friday at Lilydale McDonald's at 9:30 am, where Brett and his mighty 300 series Landcruiser was waiting.

We set out towards Yarra Glen for a quick pit stop before making our way to Mansfield BP to refuel and grab some snacks for the road. With our tanks full and spirits high, we continued our journey towards Mirimbah Park, where we aired down tyres in preparation for the trails ahead. By midday, we were ready to conquer Mount Stirling Road, Circuit Road, and Speculation Road.

Navigating through the rugged terrain proved to be slow going, especially past Little Cobbler Track, where we encountered two bog holes with no easy tracks around. After carefully assessing the depth with sticks, we chose our path and continued our ascent, mostly crawling in 1st or 2nd gear. Near the top we encountered the top three runners were hours ahead of the pack.

Upon reaching the top, we rendezvoused with Adrian, Sharon, Jurgen, Bec, and Jared the medic. Due to limited space near the parking area, we set up our camp in a clearing below. Our duties at the aid station included preparing sandwiches, cutting up fruits, handing out snacks, and pouring drinks to support the passing runners participating in the race.


Trip Report





As night fell, several runners required evacuation down to Kings Hut. By 9pm there was 6 runners waiting. Eventually a 79 series dual cab came and picked them up along with Adrian who volunteered to drive the remaining two down. Driving at night after a long day wasn't my cup of tea. Afterward, we gathered around the campfire, sharing stories and laughter over drinks before retiring for the night.

The next morning, Brett and I embarked on a hike to Mount Speculation that we wanted to do last year, relishing the awe-inspiring views from the summit



After breakfast with the group, we manned the aid station as competitors began passing through. Brett known as 'Spud Man' was frying up potato slices.



By 3pm the sweepers came through. We assisted with packing up the equipment into Adrian's 200 series Landcruiser.



We all left Mount Speculation in convoy formation - I was tail end Charlie. Jurgen was nervous tackling the bog holes. He watched Adrian picked the line, and we assured him his stock Prado was more than capable. Jurgen slowly crawled through the hole, jumped out of the car and gave his daughter a big hug!

Upon reaching the Kings Hut campground, we were greeted with a vibrant party atmosphere. Wood-fired pizzas, soups, BBQ, and beers provided by another 4x4 club added to the festive mood. Brett and I set up our swag and tent in 'tent city,' enjoying a meal with competitors and chatted about their experience. One group flew all the way down from Brisbane to compete!

By 8:30 pm, competitors had retired to their tents in preparation for the 5 am departure. I was awoken by their 4 am phone alarms but managed to roll back to sleep until 5 am. After a quick breakfast, Brett and I decided to pack up and leave instead of going back to sleep. We turned on our driving lights and embarked on some 'night' driving, navigating through King Basin Road with its low river crossings and encountering cows on Black Landing Track.

We exited via Circuit Road and Mount Stirling Road, reaching Mirimbah park by 7:30 am to air up. Brett and I bid farewell to each other before heading back to Melbourne.
