

# **Track Classifications**

<u>Four Wheel Drive Victoria</u> have a track grading classification scale which has been developed to assist in advising Trip Leaders and participants on 4WD trips of the type of tracks that they can expect to encounter. On most trips participants can expect that a variety of tracks will be traversed each with an appropriate rating. Trip Leaders should advise participants of the range of track ratings expected to be encountered on the planned route. The following classifications will assist in determining an overall Trip Rating:

# Saturday 17<sup>th</sup> August 2024.

After what seemed like the coldest winter in years, I'm sure everyone was itching to get out and do some 4wding, and it's still a long way off before the tracks reopen in November. Luckily, Ly Ho came to the rescue with a day trip to Marysville and Rubicon where we could enjoy a lovely part of the Victorian Countryside.



The weather report showed potentially 10 mm of rain so it could have turned out to be a very wet trip. Luckily it didn't materialise, and we only had a few showers.

Meetup time was 9:00 am at the Marysville bakery for a 9:30 start. Being the last to get there, I was met with a resounding "you're last, you have to write the trip report", so here we are.

With seven cars in the convoy, we headed off down the Buxton Road to the turn off at Mt Margaret Road where we aired down. From here we drove into the Cathedral State Park stopping at Cook's Mill campground for a toilet stop & group photo.



The track we were supposed to take turned out to be a walking track, so Ly had to do some quick readjustments to the plan. This was the first of a few map discrepancies still to come, we had three different maps, one paper and two digitals. I think there is a lesson there.

Backtracking to Quartz Creek Road we followed this until we hit Royston River Road which took us all the way to the Rubicon Hydro-electric Power Station.

# **Trip Report: Bruces Small Trip**

#### Details

As the saying goes in the classics, "The journey of a thousand miles starts with one step." This one had a few more miles and a lot of stages:

#### Stage 1:

However, Mount Elizabeth Station had the best showers and grass areas seen so far; put that on your list.

#### **Next stop**

Kunuurra, restock. Included a new tyre to replace the one I shredded 50km from the end. Lake Argyle, two nights stopover, best pool view.

#### Stage 4:

Bolt to Darwin, had a family bereavement, so had to do a FIFO to Melbourne for a few days.

## Stage 5:

Returning to Darwin in the wee hours of the morning, it's a quick nap, then off; Mataranka next stop, and a quick one, no springs or swim here. Daly Waters, overnight, yes, did all the tourist stuff, Kevin the Croc, horse in the bar, look in the museum, didn't sing along with Country and Western, something about bleeding ears and stop the pain! Borroloola, great spot, pool, hot showers, and washing facilities.

However, the next bit of road to Hells Gate roadhouse was a tad rough. Hells Gate, good stop as well. Croydon next overnight, park next to pub, say no more. Undara Volcanic next stop, got me some knowledge and history learning about stuff, didn't do the tour, stole the pamphlet from someone who did. 
