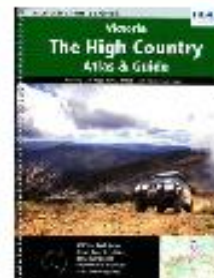

Blue Rag Range Trip

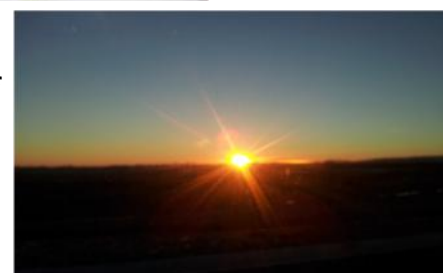
