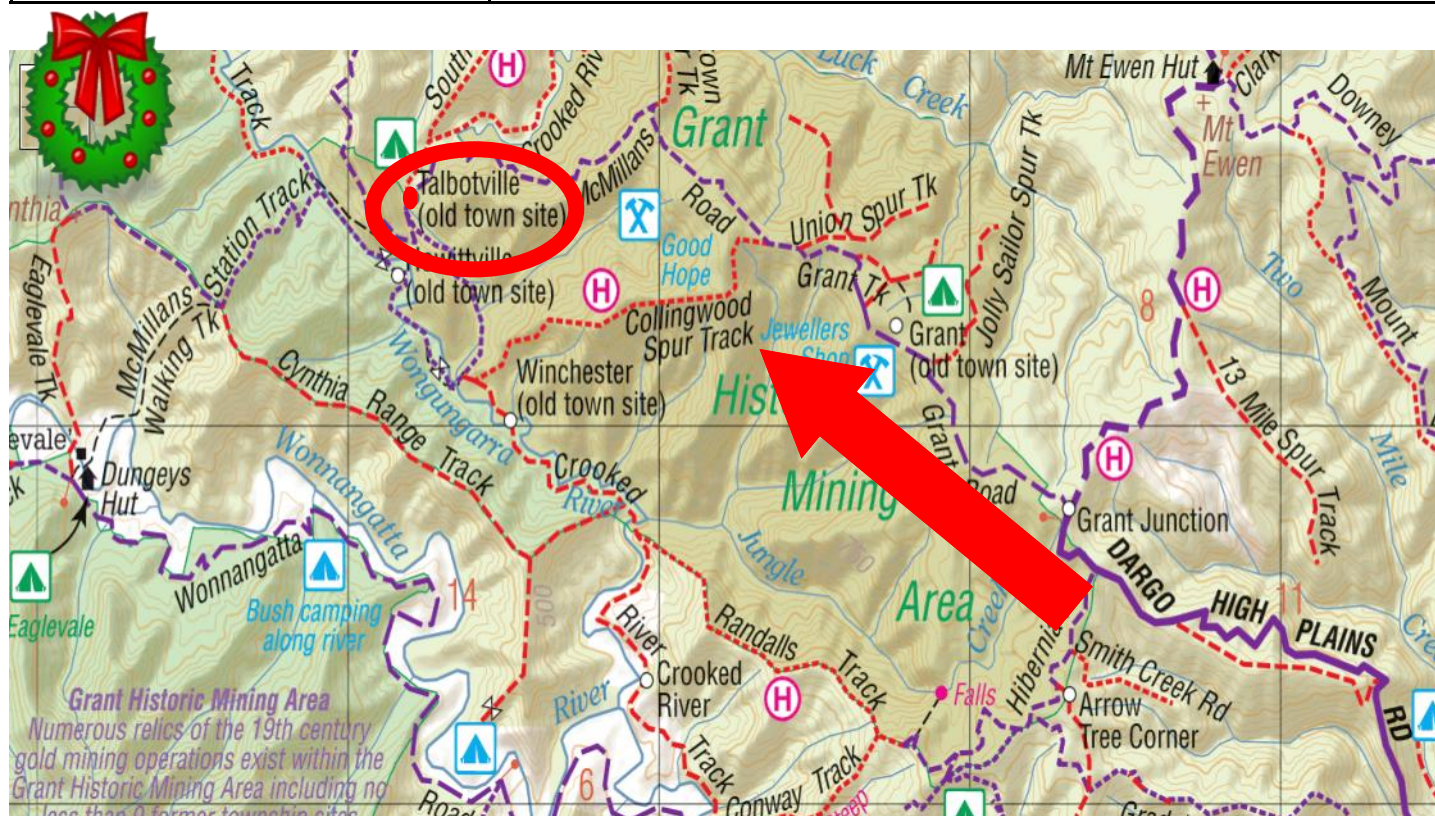

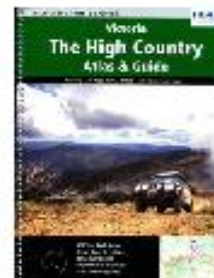

### { 14 Associate members

(1) An associate member of the Association includes—

- (a) all members under the age of 18 years;
- (b) Silver Member. A Silver Member is an active member of the club who has had 25 years continuous membership with the Association. In recognition of this the Committee of Management waives the membership fee for the Victorian Four Wheel Drive Club Inc. for these members amount of any annual subscription payable to the Association. The member is not a financial member of the Association and therefore has no voting rights and may not occupy a position on the Committee of Management. The member continues at all times to be an affiliated member of Four Wheel Drive Victoria and must through the payment, when due from time to time, of the associated affiliation fee and plus any insurance costs attributed to this category of membership. A Silver Member may, if they so decide, continue choose to be recognized recognised as Financial Member a financial member of the Association by paying their membership fee an annual subscription amount that is equal to that payable by a full fee-paying member. Payment of the fee annual subscription entitles them a Silver Member to full voting rights and allows them the Silver Member to nominate for and occupy positions on the Committee Management, if they Silver Member so wishes. Clause 14(2) does not apply if a silver member Silver Member elects to pay the Association's full association membership fee, as the member Silver Member will be considered a full fee-paying member of the association Association with the honorary title 'Silver member Member' (due to length of membership with the Association).
- (c) Gold Member. A Gold Member is an inactive member of the Association who was formerly recognised as an honorary member Member or Silver Member. Gold Members are non financial members of the Association and do not have voting rights nor may they occupy a position on the Committee of Management. Gold Members are inactive and therefore are not affiliated members of Four Wheel Drive Victoria. Gold Members are not required to pay affiliation fees and insurance costs. Gold Membership may be bestowed on a member at the instigation of the Committee of Management.
- (d) any other category of member as determined by resolution at a general meeting.

## Millers Hut

Sally and Tristan's first trip bush did not get off to the best start.

All packed up and ready to go and we start the "truck" to find a Christmas Tree of lights across the dash...not good when they relate to traction control and downhill descent controls. Quick call to Steve to say that we have to get it checked out by the mechanic and will call when we are on our way. Mechanic cleared the fault and said we need to get it fixed but will be ok for the weekend...YIPPEE we called Steve to say we are on our way to the designated meeting spot of BP Pakenham Bypass and will see them there.

Not entirely sure on where that was (newish to Melbourne) I check the wonderful Google for the address and then input it into our trusty TomTom navigation device. Little did we know it was going to take us on a self-guided TomTom adventure. What is a TomTom adventure you may ask? Well it is where you follow the directions on TomTom and end up somewhere different to the location that you want to get to. The address that you put in will be correct but the destination will be wrong and no matter how much you argue with TomTom it will say it is right. Here is how to have a TomTom adventure.

### 10 Steps to having a TomTom adventure

- Do no research as to location of meeting place.
- Input address as provided - BP Pakenham Bypass - Google tells you that the address is 93 Princes Freeway, Officer.
- Follow instructions given by TomTom blindly and believe it will get you to the right place.
- Ignore your own common sense when you arrive at what you think is the correct destination (you are just passing the Officer off ramp and there is a giant BP Service Centre. TomTom is telling you otherwise and saying that you are still 80km away so this cannot be right destination.
- Check location anyway as TomTom can get it wrong. Don't see anyone that looks like they are heading bush for a weekend or vehicle matching description that you have been given. Don't consider you may have arrived before them and use mobile phone to determine their location.
- Leave correct destination and believe TomTom is the font of all navigation knowledge so continue following directions.
- Arrive at destination as per TomTom to find that you are in a small town with no BP in sight.
- Contact trip leader and try to describe where you are (Yarragon)
- Find out you are 80kms from where you should be and that your original common sense destination was actually the correct one.
- Arrange to meet trip leader at new meeting point in Yarragon.

Steve, Nicole and family caught up to us at Yarragon and then we were on our way. We were lucky that our TomTom took us along the road to where we were meant to be heading so we did not really loose much time.

The drive up through to Licola was incredible as bush fires had only been through a month or two back. We stopped at Licola to get last minute supplies and then we headed into Millers Hut. We arrived just after dark and got the tents set up, fire going and had dinner.

Tristan and Steve headed into the bush a way to get some wood. It was a little steep so I ended up sitting in Steve's truck holding the breaks on while they collected firewood and filled the roof rack up.

The wind was howling and we were staying up to meet the next group of arrivals due in about midnight. The rain came at just after 10pm where we all went to our tents to wait for the second group.

The second group - Cat & Mark, Mark, Ian & Audrey, Owen & Amanda arrived just after midnight to pouring rain and howling wind. I was cosy and warm in the tent so did not get up to greet them. Tristan poked his head out and pulled a back muscle so was going to be no help whatsoever. Steve assisted in getting tents set up. Ian & Audrey's camper trailer was perfect for a quick set up.

The storm passed through that night and we awoke to a clear but cold day.



We had a leisurely breakfast and then got on the road to go and have a look at Horseyard and Moroka Huts. This was where the second group got to see what the road they drove in on was actually like.

Not long after we left camp there was a slight incline that was quite muddy and slippery that we all chugged through except for one who had some issues in getting up and in fact couldn't!

There was some great consternation on why this could be the case when the others had made it through...it was then determined that putting your vehicle into 4WD might be useful and surprisingly once it was engaged the traversing of



the muddy slippery hill was easy!





We took our time at each of the huts wandering around considering how difficult it would have been to get the materials to build the huts when they did as well as thinking about living in them.

We got back to camp about 3pm and then debated on whether we would go through to The Sentinels or to make camp for the evening and then go there in the morning before we left. The decision was made to stay and cook up a storm and head out in the morning before heading home.

The shelters were erected, firewood collected and chopped up and then happy hour was on. The fire was stoked up to build up coals so that the roast beef, damper, roast vegies, spit roast beef, steaks, chips, rice pudding could be cooked.

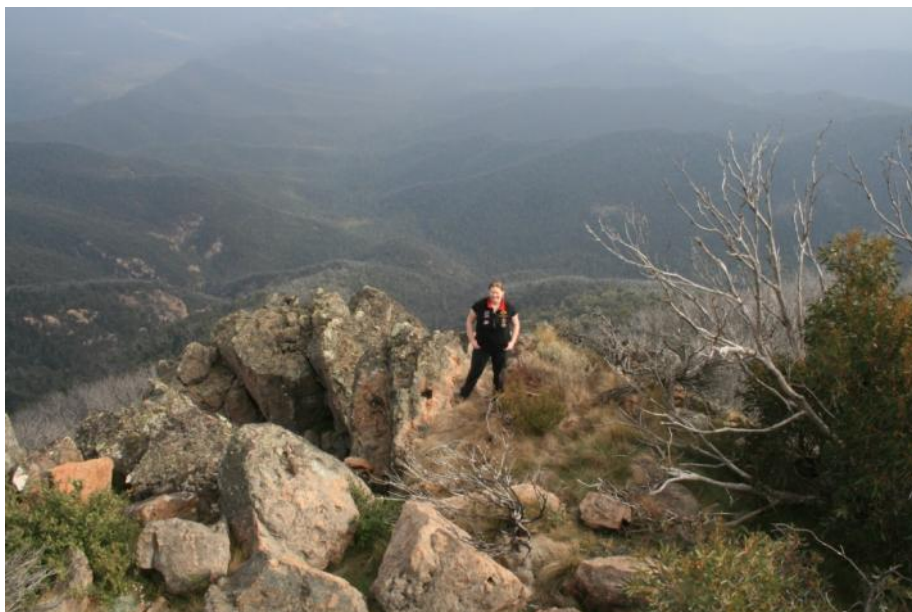

It took half an hour to walk/ climb to the edge and for me who has never been to the alpine region of Victoria and it was amazing. We returned to camp for lunch and to complete packing up and left at about 2pm. We got home around 7:30pm. It was a great weekend and we would definitely go there again.
